HOA Court Rules

In order to give respect to residents that live by the court/s, open play time is between 8 am to 9 pm daily.

1. The intention of the courts is for the enjoyment of The Shores community and continues in the tradition of a first come first serve basis. The exception is when the HOA has a scheduled HOA event using the courts, which takes priority over all court use.

If multiple groups want to use the court/s at the same time, the following courtesies set the rules for use:

- 2. A Shore's resident must always be present when non-residents are playing. The resident/s represent one household thus the use of one court. (If a husband and wife are on the courts, they represent one household thus the use of one court.) And of course they can play on the second court if it's not being used. Play can continue as long as no other groups arrive and want to play.
- 3. If another resident group arrives and wants to play, then the second court would be available to them, since only one court is available per household.
- 4. If additional groups show up to play (with at least one resident) then the new group will rotate in for one game and rotations shall continue as needed.
- 5. Want to have a reserved court? Make it open to all HOA households, and create an email invitation which would be sent out by a board member. A board member can then reserve the court for you.
