Dear Shores Residents:

Well, it looks like Spring has sprung and we thought it appropriate to update our residents on some items.

First, we will be treating the Pressurized Irrigation System in early April with bactericide and algicide and after those compounds have worked their magic, we will again flush the system. Once everything is filled and tested, we will start the system up. If everything goes according to plan, we should have irrigation water available by April 15. Please watch your email and the signs at the front pergola for the exact start-up date and time.

Second, in keeping with our policy of rotating the water start times, we have set the new times according to the irrigation map which can be found on the Shores website and is attached to this communication. Please remember to reset your watering timers so that you water **ONLY** during your assigned time slot. This will prevent overload of the system which could result in pump failure and/or low water pressure for all.

Third, as promised, and if acceptable by CDC guidelines in May, we will be holding the Annual Meeting on May 20 at 6:30 PM. We plan to hold a live meeting at the Two Rivers Clubhouse (following all applicable CDC Guidelines at the time) AND we will provide a video medium for those who prefer not to attend a live meeting. More details will follow as we track the progress of the pandemic.

Fourth, please check the trees and shrubs in the front section of your property and trim them such that they don't interfere with those walking on the sidewalks. We have a number of folks who walk in the neighborhood for exercise and everyone appreciates being able to stroll unimpeded on the sidewalks. We would hate to see anyone injured because of improperly maintained landscaping.

Fifth, according to Republic Services, their job can be made easier and more efficient if residents will place trash, recycle and compost bins on the street level (not on the sidewalk) with the wheels against the curb and with the bins at least 3' apart. The narrowest streets in The Shores are just under 20' wide and the largest refuse cans stick out about 3', so that allows almost 17' for vehicles to pass. That should be ample room for even a large truck to go past with ease. This practice is also helpful for those walking on the sidewalks so they don't have to 'dodge and weave' around refuse bins that are placed on the sidewalks.

Sixth, as with every Spring, the flow rate in the Boise River (currently about 250 cfs in the South Channel) will be increasing as snow melt begins and the US Army Corps of Engineers begins to discharge water from the 3 reservoirs to accommodate runoff. As we have in the past, we will do our best to try to keep the lake levels as constant as possible, but there will be some fluctuation as the river flow changes. So please keep this in mind as you see changes in the pond levels.

And last, Spring is the time of year when lots of folks are starting remodel or landscape modification projects and please remember that any appreciable changes to the exterior of your property must be approved by the ACC PRIOR to beginning the work. Please allow sufficient time for the committee to review and approve your project before planning to start work.

We hope this is an enjoyable and fulfilling year for you and your families and let's all try to make 2021 "The Year of the Good Neighbor" in The Shores.
