

Residents of The Shores:

Sorry for the continued bombardment of your privacy with all the emails, but we are trying to keep you all informed of what is going on. This latest issue has to do with the use of irrigation water.

You may have heard through any number of 'grape vines' that Two Rivers is currently dealing with a fairly drastic irrigation water shortage. They recently sent a notice to all their residents detailing the nature of the issue and how they are handling it. It seems that they have used up most, if not all, of their irrigation water from the Boise River and the Watermaster (person who controls distribution of irrigation water) has reduced their allocation drastically and may even cut it off all together. Those future steps depend on a lot of factors including the current heat cycle, water storage, lack of rainfall, etc. They are looking at all sorts of ways to reduce their water consumption and we felt it appropriate to try and get ahead of this if we can.

In order to try and avert any potential problems here in The Shores, we are looking at a number of things that we may have to do in the near future. **Bear in mind, that we get our water from a different ditch and we are not currently in such dire straits as Two Rivers, but it is possible that we will have some future reductions in water availability.** Our landscape contractor is skipping every other common area mowing to allow the grass to grow and help conserve water and we are currently using less than half the allotted time for common area watering but must continue to water to cool the grasses and plants down.

And now, some suggestions of what we all can do to help. First, and foremost, EVERYONE should water **ONLY** during their assigned time window (watering schedule on theshoreseagle.com website); second, try to water only every other day to conserve water; third, any ideas or thoughts you have for conserving water, please let Shelli know. It may not only help The Shores, but other neighborhoods as well.
